**CONDUCT OF THE SCHOOL-BASED REVISED CURRICULUM CAPACITY
BUILDING FOR PRIVATE SCHOOLS**

1. Cognizant of the pivotal role of private schools in elevating the quality of education by strengthening teachers' competencies in implementing the Revised K to 12 Curriculum with a particular focus on Grades 2, 3, 5, and 8, this Office, through the School Governance and Operations Division (SGOD) – School Management Monitoring and Evaluation (SMM&E) Section, in collaboration with the Curriculum Implementation Division (CID), announces the Conduct of the School-Based Revised Curriculum Capacity Building for Grades 2, 3, 5, and 8 Private School Teachers.
2. Participants to the said training are the private school teachers teaching in Grades 2, 3, 5, and 8. To ensure their adequate preparation for the effective implementation of the Revised K to 12 Curriculum in their respective schools, all private school teachers teaching Grades 2, 3, and 5 are required to participate in the upcoming training on **June 9-11, 2025** at Mother Mary Eugenie Center of Studies and Schools, Inc., MacArthur Highway, Sto. Domingo, Minalin, Pampanga. Registration starts at 7:00 a.m. to be followed shortly by an opening program at 8:00 a.m. Schedule and venue for the training of Grade 8 teachers shall be announced in a separate memorandum.
3. This division-level training on the revised curriculum for private schools aims to:
 - a. strengthen teachers' subject mastery and pedagogical expertise;
 - b. enhance teaching methodologies to improve learning outcomes;
 - c. integrate 21st century skills, inclusion principles and brain-based learning theories in teaching and learning processes;
 - d. apply pedagogical approaches and assessment per learning area for



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- e. effective lesson planning; and
 - f. exhibit positive/inclusive attitude towards the implementation of the revised curriculum.
4. To ensure proper logistics for the upcoming training, private school participants are requested to pre-register by June 1, 2025. This pre-registration will assist organizers in identifying and finalizing the official list of participants. The registration fee of P1,600 shall be paid to the zonal managers to cover related and other incidental expenses incurred during the training, to be charged against school funds.
5. To ensure active participation in the training activities and access to any online resources or materials that may be used during the sessions, participants are requested to bring their own laptops, extension cords, and possible source of internet connection.
6. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is enjoined.
