#### **DIVISION MEMORANDUM**

#### ADMINISTRATION OF RAPID MATHEMATICS ASSESSMENT (RMA) FROM KEY STAGES 1 TO 3 FOR SCHOOL YEAR 2025 - 2026

- 1. Pursuant to Regional Memorandum No. 191, s. 2025, titled "Administration of the Rapid Mathematics Assessment (RMA) for Key Stages 1 to 3," this Schools Division Office, through the Curriculum Implementation Division, announces the official testing window for the administration of the Beginning of School Year (BoSY) RMA. The pre-test shall be administered from July 7 to 11, 2025, in all public elementary and secondary schools within the division.
- 2. The implementation of the Rapid Mathematics Assessment (RMA) across Key Stages 1 through 3 serves as a vital instructional strategy in diagnosing and addressing mathematics proficiency gaps at the beginning of the school year. This assessment provides immediate and actionable data on learners' mathematical skills and understanding, enabling teachers and school leaders to design timely, targeted, and evidence-based interventions that can significantly enhance students' learning outcomes and long-term academic performance.
- 3. The soft copies of the RMA tools have been disseminated via the official group chats of District Mathematics Representatives (DMRs) and Junior High School (JHS) mathematics leaders. The printing and/or reproduction of the assessment materials shall be charged against the School's Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) or other available local funds, subject to the usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
- 4. The Education Program Supervisors (EPSs) and Public Schools District Supervisors (PSDSs) are directed to supervise, monitor, and evaluate the conduct of the RMA pre-test administration. They are also expected to provide immediate technical assistance and recommend appropriate solutions to any issues or challenges that may arise during the implementation.
- 5. Please refer to the Enclosure for the following documents necessary for the smooth conduct of the assessment: (1) List of Assigned Monitoring Supervisors, (2) Teacher's Report on the Results of the Rapid Mathematics Assessment, (3) School Report on the Results of the Rapid Mathematics Assessment, (4) Division







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Identified Most Learned and Least Learned Competencies, (5) Monitoring Tool for Rapid Mathematics Assessment, and (6) Intervention/Remediation Plan for the Identified Learning GAPS (Least Learned Competencies) on Rapid Mathematics Assessment.

6. In line with this, all designated elementary and JHS mathematics leaders are advised to attend the orientation on the administration of the RMA pre-test. The schedule of the orientation is as follows:

- 7. In cases where the scheduled orientation conflicts with teachers' regular class schedules, school heads must implement appropriate measures in compliance with DepEd Order No. 9, s. 2005 (Instituting Measures to Increase Engaged Time-on-Task and Ensuring Compliance Therewith). Transportation, meals, and other incidental expenses of participants shall be charged to their respective school MOOE or other local funds, subject to the usual government accounting and auditing rules and procedures.
- 8. This Memorandum shall serve as the **official travel authority** for all personnel involved in the administration of the RMA pre-test for School Year 2025–2026.
- 9. Immediate and wide dissemination of this Memorandum is highly desired to ensure smooth coordination and implementation of the scheduled activities.
