

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g. Vicinity Map



B. Participants

- Participants are registered senior scouts.
- A minimum of twenty (20) and maximum of forty (40) scouts per institution or combination of joining institutions.
- All participants must be in Type A, Type B or Type C uniform wearing the official neckerchief of the Boy Scouts of the Philippines. Other Scouts paraphernalia such as Crew Flags, Radian Stick, Beret, Head Gear, Gloves, Lanyards. Etc. are allowed and must have corresponding point credits.
- Fancy Drill performance with musical accompaniment from a Drum and Bugle corps and or Audio Soundtrack will be allowed.

C. Duration/ Scoring/ Preparations/ Cultural Dance Proper:

- The time limit for each presentation is on six (6) minutes to eight (8) minutes. This includes the entrance and exit. A deduction of five (5) points will be imposed for first 1 minute or its fractional parts in excess of eight (8) minutes and one (1) point for every succeeding minute or its fractional parts.
- Scoring or judging shall start after the SALUTATION OF UNIT to the Board of Judges and the raising of Green Flag signals to start.
Time Flag Signals:

 - Yellow - warning signals at 6 minutes
 - Red - Signal after 10 minutes performance with penalty or point deduction for extra time consumed

- Each correct answer is equivalent to 5 points.

4. Judging Criteria

- Taste & Flavor (40%) Authenticity of taste, balance of flavors, correct seasoning according to Kapampangan recipe 40 pts
- Cooking Technique (25%) Proper use of palayok, kawayan, wood, and charcoal; mastery of traditional cooking methods 25 pts
- Presentation & Creativity (15%) Visual appeal, arrangement, and originality while staying traditional 15 pts
- Use of Ingredients (10%) Proper and authentic use of local ingredients; no shortcuts or modern substitutes 10 pts
- Cultural Storytelling (10%) Explanation of the dish's history, origin, or significance in Kapampangan culture 10 pts

Total: 100 points

Judges: Local culinary experts, senior scouts, and cultural advocates.

5. Contest Flow

- Registration & Orientation – Teams are briefed about rules, cooking areas, and time limits.
- Cooking Session – Maximum cooking time: 60–90 minutes.
