Ekat stood up and hurriedly ran to Ms. Pentak's class and handed over the money which she found.

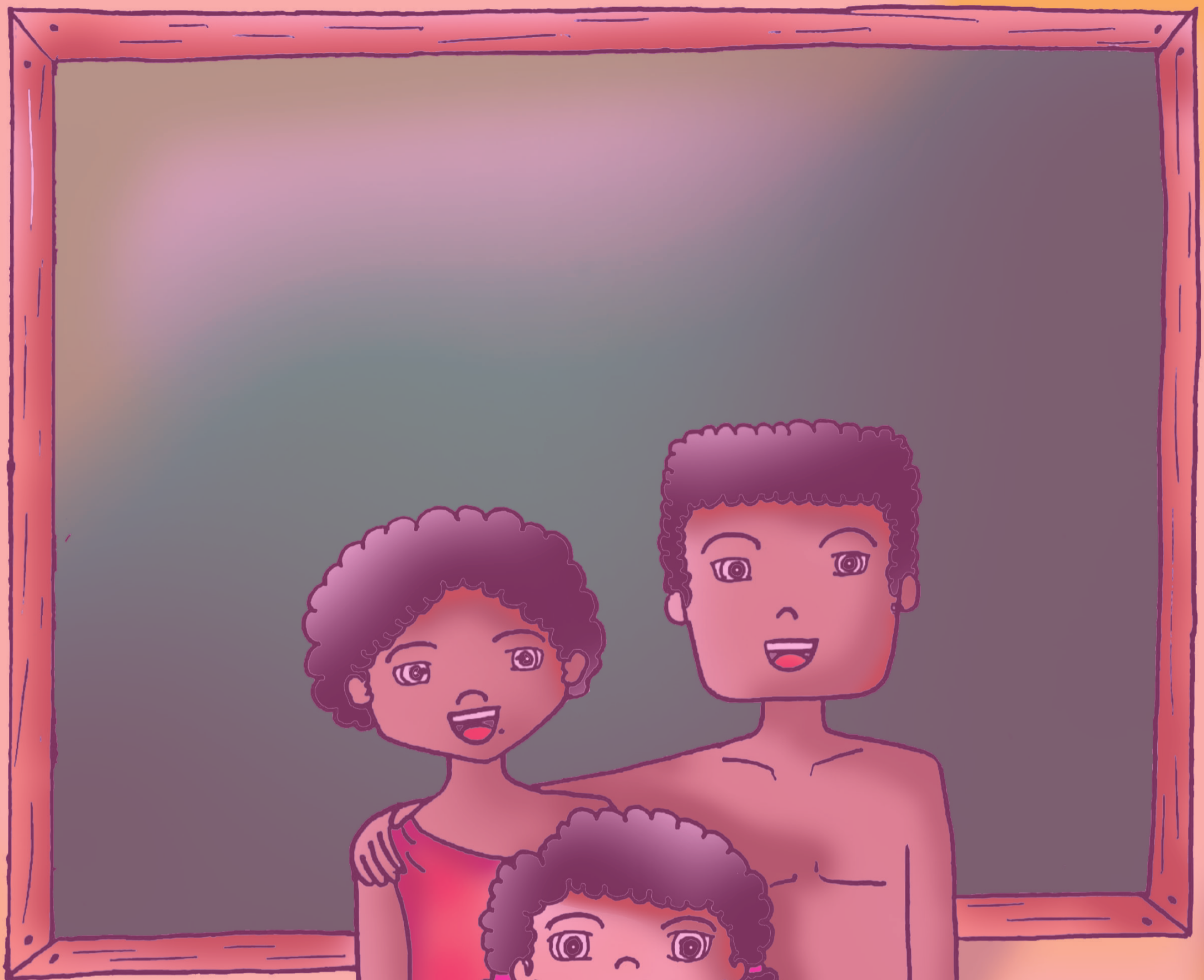


Ms. Pentak thanked Ekat. She gave her a pack of bitter gourd.
