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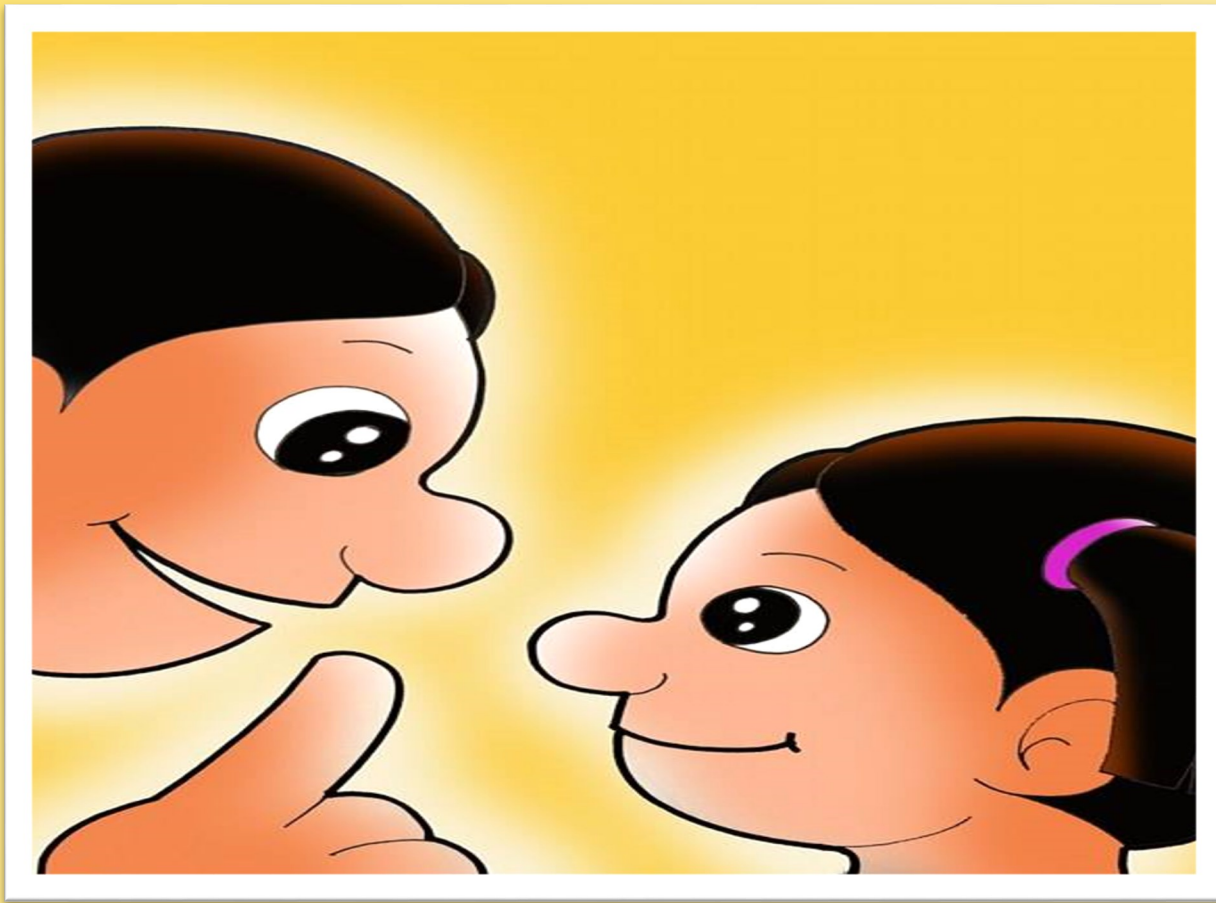

happily.**



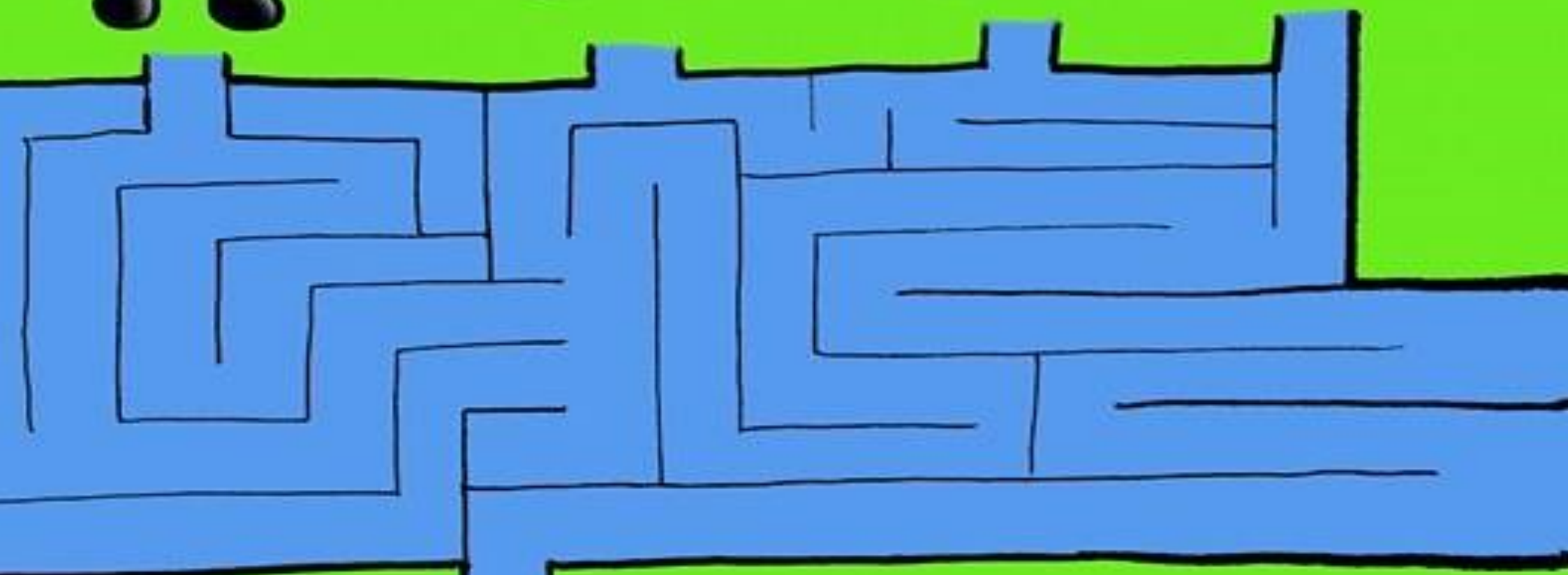

Let us help Claire to share her foods to her friends.

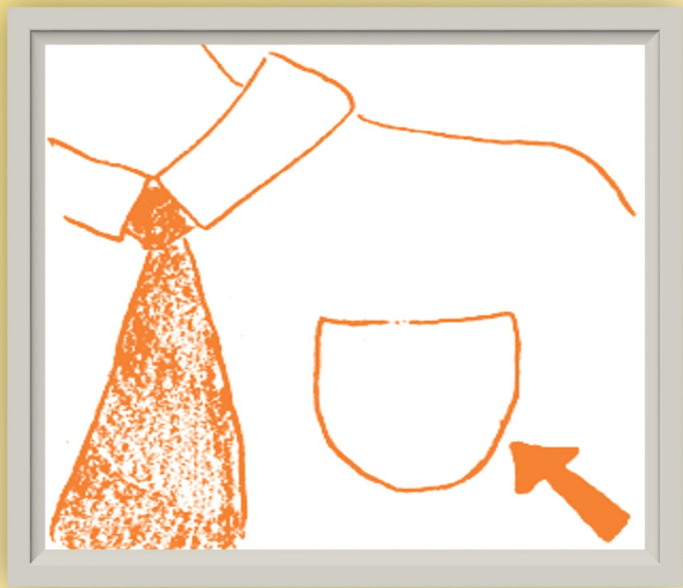
